Fungi are not animals or plants, but they are part of biodiversity also. Fungi simply do not fit these inadequate CBD definitions, and they are suffering as a result. The need for their protection has been established, but the convention has provided no machinery for ensuring it happens. Many national biodiversity action plans produced in response to the convention fail to consider fungi at all. As David Hawksworth, one of the world's leading fungal experts so eloquently put it, fungi are truly "the orphans of Rio".
